Why Australia for education?

1. Strong rate of satisfaction amongst international students (2012)

Of 53,500 surveyed international students studying in Australia:

- ▶ 87% of were either "very satisfied" or "satisfied" with their **overall experience** in Australia (up from 86% in 2010)
- ▶ 86% of were either "very satisfied" or "satisfied" with their **study experience** in Australia (up from 84% in 2010)
- ▶ 88% of were either "very satisfied" or "satisfied" with **living in Australia** (up from 86% in 2010)

Top five factors why higher education international students chose Australia:

Quality of teaching (96%) reputation of qualification & institution (94%); Personal safety (93%); and, reputation of Australian education system (92%)



Regulatory framework supporting international education

- ESOS (Education Services for Overseas Students) Act The legislation:
- 1. Protects international students coming to Australia on student visas
- Education institutions teaching international students have clear roles and responsibilities towards them
- CRICOS (Commonwealth Register Of Institutions And Courses For Overseas Students) – CRICOS number must be displayed
- TEQSA (Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency) The Authority

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Australia Qualifications Framework

- A single national framework of qualifications
- Easily understood and compared within Australia by students, employers and education institutions
- Can be used to access further learning
- Can be benchmarked against qualifications from other countries




Differentiating Australian education from other countries
