
# International student mobility

International students have chosen France




France welcomes more international students than any country except the US, UK and Australia.

- 2.6 million students enrolled in higher education institutions and programs in France (2016–2017)
- 310 000 international students (12.1%)
  - → up 90% from 1998

# Tuition and fees for major national diplomas at public institutions in 2017–2018

- Tuition costs in French public institutions are among the lowest in the world.
- All students, French and foreign, benefit from an indirect tuition subsidy averaging €14,000 per year

# Welfare and benefits

# Foreign students are eligible to the SAME benefits as French students

- Housing subsidies
- Social Security: only 211 € (1 815 HKD) / year (Reimburse
   60 % of medical expenses)
  - Optional medical insurance: around 63€ (540 HKD) / year (reimburse the remaining 40 % of medical expenses)
- Student reduction for movies, theatre, public transport, university canteen etc.
- Legal right to work part-time (964h / year,
   SMIC: 9,67 €)
















# Programs taught in English

# 3,500 public and private institutions

- 25 Clusters of universities and other institutions
- 73 Universities (all public) and equivalent institutions (public and private) enrolling 1.5 million students (62% of postsecondary enrollments)
- **270**Doctoral departments
- 227 Schools of engineering authorized to award the professional title of engineer (25% university-based)
- 220 Schools of business and management (90 conferring state-accredited diplomas)
  - 50 Postsecondary schools of art
  - 22 Schools of architecture

# **Universities**

- France's universities are publicly funded and located in every region of the country.
- ◆ The universities confer (i) national diplomas (Licence, Master, Doctorate) that have the same academic value regardless of where they are awarded, and (ii) other diplomas that are specific to the university that confers them.
- Enrollment in the first year is open to all students holding a French baccalauréat or equivalent diploma signifying completion of secondary study.
- University programs are available in all domains of teaching and research (sciences, letters, languages, arts, humanities, health, athletics, and more).
- ◆ The universities enroll 219,939 international students (73.6% of all international students in France).









# The Grandes Écoles

- ◆ Some of the Grandes Écoles are public; some are private. They include schools of engineering, the venerable écoles normales supérieures (ENS), institutes of political science (IEP), schools of business and management, veterinary schools, and other specialized schools.
- They offer professional education of a very high caliber.
- Admission is highly selective.
- Grandes Écoles recognized by the French government grant diplomas from the baccalauréat to the graduate (5-year) level.
   Some confer diplomas officially recognized as the equivalent of the Master.
- The Grandes Écoles charge tuition that is higher than that of the universities.
- Many courses and some entire programs are taught in English.
- In 2015, France's Grandes Écoles enrolled 58,022 international students (2015).








# Focus on management programs

- ◆ Training in management remains a strong point of French higher education.
- ✓24 French schools were among the Financial Times' top-ranked Masters of Management in 2017.
- √The top MBA is French (INSEAD)

  (Financial Times 2017 ranking)
- √14 French institutions hold triple accreditation (AACSB, AMBA, EFMD), an accomplishment unique in Europe
- ◆ Programs in the Grandes Écoles
- ✓Programs are offered at various levels.
- ✓Institutional quality is reflected in objective criteria.
- √Most schools are private.
- University-based programs
- ✓Programs tend to be research-oriented.
- ✓University-based schools of management are known as IAEs (institutes of business administration)
- ◆Some 20 schools that confer the title of engineer offer specializations in management.

# Public postsecondary schools of art and applied arts

- ◆ The higher schools of art overseen by the Ministry of Culture and Communication
  - ✓ Almost 50 public postsecondary schools of art and design with a national or regional mandate
  - ✓ Programs in art, design, communication at 3 levels: undergraduate (3 years) and master's level (3+2 years) degrees and some post-master offerings)
  - ◆ The higher schools of applied arts overseen by the Ministry of National Education, Higher Education, and Research
  - ✓ 4 renowned public schools: Boulle, Estienne, Duperré, Olivier de Serres
  - ✓ National diplomas (2 and 4 years) in highly specialized areas: graphic design; spatial design; fashion, textiles and environment; art-related products, services, and occupations

Levels in French language required for admission to postsecondary programs

- As long as the HKDSE result satisfies the entry requirement of the local universities, students can apply for French university.
- Levels of proficiency needed to study in France
  - ✓ Level B2 of the CEFR is required to enroll in the first year of postsecondary study.
  - ✓ A higher level (CI or C2) may be required by some institutions for certain fields of study.


