Living in Germany

- 16 federal states with a distinct regional identity, different educational systems
- Highly developed: quality of life, human development, press freedom, democratic norms, low corruption and crime rate
- Good work-life balance: 41-hour work week, guaranteed 30 annual leave days, well-organized social security



Diverse Germany

- Biggest immigrant nation in Europe, No.2 in the world
- Popular study destination
- Over 700.000 people with immigration backgrounds have started their own company in Germany
- German government/ companies actively encourage immigration of skilled workers, students

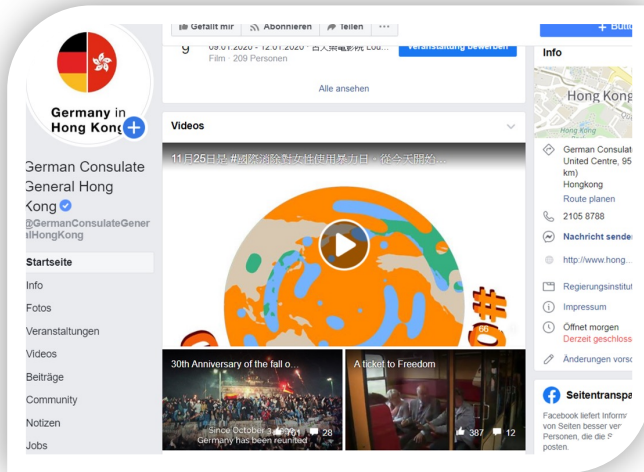

Universities

- Total number: 107+
- Focus on theoretical knowledge
- Compulsory courses, but also many electives
- Research oriented, a research-based final thesis
- Sometimes very large institutions with up to 50,000 students

Music, Art and Film Colleges

- total number: 52
- Focus on practical application
- Admission often based on portfolios and aptitude tests
- Artistic subjects such as design, graphics, music, camera work
- Degrees available: Bachelor's, Master's, State Exam, PhD

Universities of Applied Sciences

Fachhochschule / Hochschule für Angewandte Wissenschaften

應用科學大學 (應用科技大學)

- Total number: 213
- Focus practical application and strong links to the corporate world
- Set course groups, stronger student-professor relationship
- Degrees available: Bachelor's, Master's, PhD (in cooperation)
- Often smaller regional Universities



International Programmes

- Courses usually taught in **English**
- No need to show proof of any German language skills
- International Programmes at all levels across Germany
- Internationally recognised degrees
- Intensive support for international students

- 
- Chose one or several programmes which you are interested in
 - Go to uniassist. They will check your documents
 - Parallely get into contact with the international offices of the universities of your choice.
 - They will tell you about specific deadlines, conditions, financing
 - Apply according to the information given by the international office and uniassist
 - Once you have the admission of the university, start visa procedure
 - Parallely look for housing in the city of your choice
 - Book flight

9-week general language courses at levels A1 to C2 throughout the year once a week at lunchtime, in the evening or at the weekend as well as summer intensive and super intensive courses.





Visa application - FAQ

Can I work while studying?

Foreign students are allowed to work 120 full days or 240 half-days – more if they have jobs as student or graduate assistants.

Can I work in Germany after graduating?

You have 18 months after graduation to find a job in Germany

Do I have to study at a public university?

You can study at private universities if they are recognized by the state

Can I do a second Bachelor programme in Germany?

Max. 1 Bachelor and 1 Master at a German university
